The bigger picture




Non-communicable diseases (NCDs) are responsible for **80% of the disease burden** in EU countries

Improved health promotion and disease prevention can **reduce the prevalence** of NCDs by as much as **70%**

The UN Sustainable Development Goals


By 2030, reduce one third premature mortality from NCD through prevention and treatment and promote mental health and well-being



The bigger picture – policy progress

- Process indicators for implementation of ulletrecommended NCD policies and capacities show significant variation
- Less than half have fully adopted recommended NCD policies
- **Substantial potential** to support improvement








Aim and objectives of JA PreventNCD

















External Experts Advisory Board

- Hugely impressive and inspiring project!
- Match the unprecedented and bold investment with equally **bold activities**
- Identify short list of core target outcomes
- Increase emphasis on upstream/structural action over individual level actions
- Clearly articulate what the project is and how it will achieve impact through a theory of change for the overall project
- Strive to ensure that the huge number of discrete activities are integrated as much as possible
- Make use of existing frameworks, methods and tools







Identified challenges

Secure **solid implementation and documentation of pilot actions** to qualify as best practice



Secure meaningful **engagement** of key target groups, including youth and vulnerable groups



Allow for **scaling up** of identified best and promising practice within a short project period



Identifying key leverage points for policy change across sectors




Secure a **proper balance** between **individual level** targeted actions, largely aimed at **people in high-risk groups**, and **population targeted polices** addressing **structural** factors



Delayed EU legal **initiatives** related to NCD risk factors
